All alcohol and/or drug related offences must be reported. This means even if you successfully complete all program requirements and get a degree when you apply to take the ARRT certification exam you may be denied. This will prevent you from working as a Radiation Therapist. Contact the program if you have been convicted of a crime. You will be instructed to submit an <u>Ethics Review Preapplication</u> (pdf) to the ARRT to determine your eligibility to take the examination upon completion of the program.
